

## Home activities

Week beginning 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2020

<u>MONDAY</u>	<u>Challenge activities</u>
English: Read for 10 minutes with an adult or brother or sister. Practice sight words.	Retell the story. What happened at the beginning, in the middle and at the end?
Phonics: Think of 10 words with the <b>sh</b> and <b>ch</b> diagraphs e.g. shop, chick. Robot them for a grown up.	Write a sentence using one of the words.
Maths: Count how many star jumps you can do in 1 minute.	Can you draw that number? E.g. if you did 15 jumps, draw 15 spots/cars/sweets/flowers.

<u>TUESDAY</u>	<u>Challenge activities</u>
English: Read for 10 minutes with an adult or brother or sister. Practice sight words.	Draw a character from the book. Write their name in a sentence underneath. E.g. This is goldilocks.
Phonics: Think of as many words as you can, that rhyme with <b>pet</b> . Robot 3 of them for a grown up.	Write the words in a list.
Maths: Order the people in your family from tallest to shortest.	Can you draw your family in order of tallest to shortest?

<u>WEDNESDAY</u>	<u>Challenge activities</u>
English: Read for 10 minutes with an adult or brother or sister. Practice sight words.	How many sight words you can find in the story?
Phonics: Think of 8 words that have the <b>j</b> or <b>w</b> sound e.g. jam, wet. Robot them for a grown up.	Write a sentence using one of the words.
Maths: Count how many spoons there are in your kitchen.	How many would you have if I gave you 1 more? 1 less? 3 more?

<u>THURSDAY</u>	<u>Challenge activities</u>
English: Read for 10 minutes with an adult or brother or sister. Practice sight words.	Tell an adult or brother or sister what your favourite part of the story was and why. Remember to use the word <b><u>because</u></b>
Think of as many words as you can, that rhyme with <b>king</b> Choose 3 words, finger the word and count the number of sounds. E.g. k-i-ng 3 sounds, s-w-i-ng is 4 sounds	Write the words in a list.
Maths: Look for shapes in your house. The door is a rectangle. Do you have a circle shaped clock?	Draw some of the shapes that you found.

<u>FRIDAY</u>	<u>Challenge activities</u>
<p>English:</p> <p>Read for 10 minutes with an adult or brother or sister.</p> <p>Practice sight words.</p>	<p>Play diagraph detectives. Find a page in the story and see how many diagraphs you can spot.</p> <p>Look out for sh, th, ch, ng, ai, ee, oa, ar, or.</p>
<p>Phonics:</p> <p>Think of 10 words with the <b>z</b> or <b>v</b> sounds e.g. zip, van</p>	<p>Can you think of some nonsense (made up) words using the sounds? E.g. hov, zeg, vump</p>
<p>Maths:</p> <p>Find 10 socks. Put them into 2 piles. How many different ways can you split them? E.g. a pile of 6 and a pile of 4</p>	<p>Can you make it into a number sentence?</p> <p>Eg. 6 and 4 is 10</p> <p>or <math>6 + 4 = 10</math></p>
