In your house, in your garden, they hide everywhere! We have lots of ideas to begin to find out all about minibeasts. This topic includes body parts, 6 legs, 8 legs, more legs, no legs, movement, colour and lots more!

Activity	How to do it	Or
Go on a bug hunt!	Have a look outside, or around your house for any bugs you can find. Are there spiders in the corner? Ants on the floor? Flies buzzing at the window?	Maybe your grown-up could write you a list of bugs to findtick them off when you've spotted them!
Watch Mrs Storey's video to learn the insect song 'Head, Thorax, Abdomen' Now join in!	Follow the link in the email from Miss Jones to watch Mrs Storey sing the song! You can play it as many times as you like for one week before it disappears!	See if you can find a different song about insects on youtube.
Make a butterfly, a ladybird or a bee	Cut a paper plate in half. Paint it. Add legs, antennae and wings!	No paper plates? Try a toilet roll tube, or paper.
Counting out 6 legs!	Get a ball of dough and 6 lolly sticks or straws, and stick them into the dough, counting up to 6.	Instead of one blob of dough for the body, try 3 just like Mrs Storey's song
Sing Incy Wincy Spider	You know the words! Sing along with someone in your house, and talk about the rhyming words (spout/out, rain/again)	Can you make up a new verse? Incy Wincy Spider climbing up the?

Move like an insect	https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=7xyXB8_BetQ Copy the moves in this song and move like a bug!	Imagine you are a worm, bee or a butterfly and see if you can move like one!
Use vegetables to make a minibeast	With help from a grown-up, cut up some vegetables (tomatoes, cucumber, peppers or grapes) and make them into a minibeast	Or make a long repeating vegetable pattern!

Dress up as a minibeast	Using any material or clothing you can, dress up like a minibeasta scarf could be butterfly wings, a stripy jumper makes you a beeor roll up in fabric or a sleeping bag and be a worm!	Maybe you've already got some wings? Which minibeast could you be?
Dig for worms	Using a spade or a spoon, dig for worms! You might even find a woodlouse!	Orsee our next suggestion!
Make a pebble beetle	Find a pebble. Paint it. Draw on eyes and any patterns you like.	Now play hide and seek with it with someone in your house! (painting a bright bug like a ladybird makes it easier to find!)

Ant trap!	Cut a satsuma in half. Take it outside and leave it on the ground. Go away for 2 hours, then come back to see if anything has crawled on for a snack!	Maybe you could take a photo of what you find.

Make a Thumbelina Party Bug!	Follow the directions in this video to make your own minibeast finger puppet https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/makes/cbeebies-house-thumbelina-make?collection=cbeebies-house-makes	You could do a puppet show when you're done!
Make a spiders web!	Using wool and lolly sticks make your own spider's web! Glue some raisins onto your wool to be flies stuck in the web!	Draw a spider's web on the patio outside using chalk!
Make an insect out of found objects outside	You could useleaves, sticks, petals, grass, pebbles, feathers and anything else!	
Symmetrical butterfly painting	Take a piece of paper and fold it in half. Paint splats of lots of colours onto one half of the paper. Fold the other side over and squash it down! Open it up again to see your symmetrical pattern	When its dry your grown-up could cut it into a butterfly shape!
Break out of a cocoon!	Wrap your child in toilet roll (if you have enough!) and see how hard it is for a butterfly to emerge from it's chrysalis!	Not got enough loo roll? Wrap yourself up using sheets, towels or scarves! Photos please!
