Take a look at the different bins your rubbish goes into!	Ask a grown-up to show you the big outside bins that you have. Do you have a green bin? Or a brown one? Do you use orange bags? Where do you sort your rubbish in your house?	Ask your grown-up how you sort your rubbish in the kitchen? Where does glass and plastic go? What about cardboard?
This isn't a boxit's a	Find a cardboard box and see what else it could becould it be a rocket? A basketball hoop? A cot for a baby? A shopping trolley?	If you can't find a big box, try a smaller one! Is it a treasure chest? A money box or a house for an ant?
Skittles	Find some (10 is a good number) plastic bottles. Stand them up in a group. Use a ball to try to knock them over.	You could also write numbers on them and then aim for a particular one!

Make a tub drum!	With some help from a grown-up find a clean, empty plastic tub (margarine tubs work well), cover the top with greaseproof paper and fasten it on with an elastic band! Now you've got your very own drum! Bang it with your hand or find a beater!	No greaseproof paper? Try cling film instead

Sort your recycling.	Using 3 different shopping bags, sort your recycling into what it is made ofcardboard, plastic and glass. (Be careful with glass items)	If you don't have bags to sort them into, just try piles on the floor.
Collect things to recycle by taking to a charity shop	With your grown-up, sort through any old clothes, things you have outgrown, or toys you no longer play with, and put them in a bag to take to a charity shop when the lockdown ends. Play at 'Charity Shop'	Collect together lots of items you could sell…old shoes, old toys, old handbags, clothes you have outgrown, unwanted gifts, old sunglasses…Now pretend to be the shop keeper and get your family to buy things!	You could even pretend using real pennies!

Make a tower as tall as you!	Find as many cardboard boxes as you can, and see if you can stack them as high as the top of your head.	Too easy? Now try one as tall as your grown-up!
Make a pattern out of bottle tops	See how many different kinds of bottle tops you can collect. Arrange them into a repeating pattern, or a pretty design.	Don't fancy a pattern? Why not number them and put them in order to 10.
Cut out pictures from takeaway menus	Find a fun use for all of those takeaway menus! With some help, practice cutting up the menus.	If you are good at cutting, cut out the yummiest looking food and stick it onto some paper and make your own menu. Now play restaurants!

Make a recycling rainbow	Using any coloured paper you can find (tissue/magazines/packaging/paper/card/fabric) and glue it to make a rainbow!	Try using coloured rice or glitter instead
Write your name in a cardboard box	Find an item of recycling on which you can practice your writing	If you don't want to write your name, try drawing a picture or a pattern
Make a car out of a toilet roll tube!	See pictures below for ideas	Don't fancy a car? Try one of our other ideas

Junk modelling	Using any recycling items, try to make them into a castle for your toys! Extra points for a drawbridge or turrets.	If you've only got a shoe box, try making that into a carpark for your toy cars!
Recycled boatsink or float?	Make a boat out of different containers (strawberry tub, drinking cup, half an orange skin) stick a straw onto a blob of dough to make a mast and see if it floats!	Make your boat out of lego instead
Cardboard marble run	Using cardboard tubes and masking tape, attach tubes to kitchen cupboards and see if you can get a ball, marble or pompom to travel down it! Catch it in a bowl at the end!	See pictures below for more ideas!
