


Year 1 Activities for other subjects Week 10: 15th June

Monday 15 th	Art	<p>You're going to create your own piece of transportation! Before you build it, you'll need to first design what it will look like. Think about the colours you want to use, whether your transportation flies, floats or has wheels, etc. You'll also need to name your new piece of transportation. Sketch your ideas down on a piece of paper. <p>Tuesday 16th</p>	<p>D&T</p>	<p>Build a model of the transportation you designed. Use can use whatever materials you have on hand at home. Based on your sketch, have a think about what materials would be best when constructing it. For example, if you designed a boat, would paper or plastic be better to use? What hold up better in water? Remember: You're building based on what your sketch looks like. <p>Wednesd ay 17th</p>	<p>PSHE</p>	<p>Have a discussion with a grownup about the people in our communities that help us in emergency situations. Firstly, think about what an emergency situation is. If you had to, what number would you call (999)? With COVID-19, there has been a lot of talk about 'essential employees'. Essential employees are those that typically help us in the case of an emergency. Can you think of any essential jobs and how they are currently helping us? Create a poster of an essential employee doing their job. <p>Thursday 18th</p>	<p>Music</p>	<p>Think about and use the sounds of daily life. With a grownup, explore the sounds heard on different journeys. For example: -What does the journey to the park sound like? What may you hear on the way? -A journey around a supermarket will involve a range of different sounds. -A journey to school, whether by foot, by bus or in a car will also involve a range of sounds. Listen out for sounds on journeys and think about how these sounds could be recreated at home. You and a grownup could create a piece of music together that represents the different types of journeys that you make. <p>Friday 19th</p>	<p>Computing</p>	<p>Use a digital recorder to record yourself creating different sound effects to everyday sounds. You can choose to recreate your own sounds or choose from the following list: - A dog barking. - A car engine turning on. - A phone ringing. - Typing on a tablet, phone or computer. - A door opening. - A rocket launching. - Trees blowing in the wind. Once you record your sounds, make sure you save your work so you're able to listen to it.</p>	<p>To do this activity, you'll need some voice recording software, which the majority of iPhone and Android devices already have built into them called 'Voice Memos.'</p> <p>If there is not one already built into your device, search "voice recorder" into your app store. Many free options come up to download. If you'd prefer not to download an app, this link takes you to a voice recorder that you can access through any web browser. You just need to make sure whichever device you plan to use it on has a built in microphone (which most devices do): https://www.rev.com/onlinevoicerecorder</p>
