

Monday	Topic - Bigger Picture	<p>Environmental Impact - Should we be made to only have one car per family?</p> <p>Discuss: What are some good things about having only one car? What are some good things about having more than one car?</p> <p>Activity: With a growing up, make a pro and con list of having more than one car.</p> <p>A pro is the good side of something and a con is the bad side of something. On the 'pro' side, list out all of the things that are good about having more than one car. Tuesday	Science / D&T	<p>With all this sunny weather, we need to remember that we can't look directly at the sun. This activity is a creative way for children to safely look at the sun's reflections.</p> <p><b>Activity:</b> Make a pinhole camera.</p> <p><b>Materials:</b> 2 pieces of white card stock. Aluminium foil. Tape. Cut a square hole into the middle of one of your pieces of card stock.</p> <p>2. Tape a piece of aluminum foil over the hole.</p>
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3. Use your pin or paper clip to poke a small hole in the aluminum foil.



4. Place your second piece of card stock on the ground and hold the piece with aluminum foil above it (foil facing up). Stand with the sun behind you and view the projected image on the card stock below! The farther away you hold your camera, the bigger your projected image will be. To make your projection a bit more defined, try putting the bottom piece of card stock in a shadowed area while you hold the other piece in the sunlight.

Wednesday	PE	<p>Have a go playing the game 'Toothpaste!' This game requires 3 or more people so you will need to play with some members of your household.</p> <p>To play:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. One person is chosen to be on one side of the garden/house/field/etc. by themselves, with everyone else on the other side. This chosen person is 'it.'</li> <li>2. The person standing alone ('it") gets to say a category of their choice (for example: colors, teachers, candy bars, etc.).</li> <li>3. Once the topic is announced, the rest of the players (quietly, so 'it' doesn't hear) state what they are (if the topic is "colours", one person is yellow, another is green...).</li> </ol> <p>Everyone needs a different answer.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>4. Once everyone is ready, 'it' shouts out one of the words such as yellow (depending on the topic picked). If the word chosen is not being used by one of the players, the person who is "it" tries again with another word.</li> <li>5. Once 'it' shouts a word that matches one of the answers picked, 'it' and the player with the corresponding color, race across to see who reaches the other side first (they will be running in opposite directions).</li> </ol>	<p><a href="https://www.funology.com/toothpaste/">https://www.funology.com/toothpaste/</a></p>
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Thursday	Music / Art	<p>Dance with your hands!</p> <p>Have a grownup play you some music. While listening to the music, think about how it makes your feel. Use crayons, pencils, felt tips, paint, etc. and create a piece of artwork from the sound of the music.</p> <p>Experiment with different types of music. Does rock music make you want to paint dark speckles all over your paper? Does Disney music make you want to use colourful strokes? Etc.</p>	<p>Choose songs from a variety of different genres.</p> <p>Rock, pop, folk, classical, Disney, hiphop, etc.</p>
