<p><b>Grammar:</b> <b><u>Sentence Types</u></b></p> <p><b><u>Commands</u></b> Command sentences are used when you are telling someone to do something. Commands usually start with an imperative verb, also known as a 'bossy verb', because they tell someone to do something.</p> <p><b>Example: Fetch me some biscuits.</b></p> <p>In your workbook, write 5 command sentences.</p> <p><b>Example: Tidy up your room as soon as possible.
