Geography

Use the internet and try and see if you can answer these questions. You could make this into an information book, a poster about the country, a PowerPoint, do whatever you like! If you can't use the internet, maybe you could ask an adult what they know about Egypt.

USE AN ATLAS/GOOGLE MAPS/GOOGLE EARTH

Where is Egypt? Can you describe using compass points, continent names? What borders Egypt? Which hemisphere is it in? Is it North or South of equator, North or south of Tropics of cancer and Capricorn? What major cities are in Egypt? Where are they located? Are they in the North, South, East or West of the country? Are they near the sea or inland? Are they near any other physical features such as a river? Why are they there?

Physical Features

These are things like rivers, mountains, deserts and other natural things.

Can you find out about the river Nile?

How long is it? Where does it start (called the "source")?

Where does it go into the sea (called the "mouth")?

What little rivers join it (called "tributaries")?

Can you find out about different mountain ranges in Egypt?

What is the tallest mountain in each range?

How high is it?

How long is the range?

Where it can be found in Egypt?

Can you find out about the deserts in Egypt?

How big is it?

Where is it?

What animals and plants live in it?

Can you find out about the weather?

What is the climate?

How much rainfall do they have every year?

What is the average temperature at different times of the year?

Use online maps and Google Earth to explore the world.

Have a look at the website National geographic kids.

Search for Egypt in the top right corner of the website there is loads of interesting facts.

Can you think of a song to help you remember them or think up another way to remember them? Can you draw a skeleton and label it? Can you find out how your muscles work? 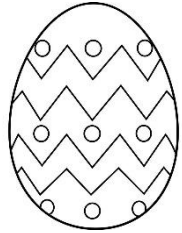
