


Year 4 Activities for other subjects

Monday 15th	D&T Food	<p>The Parthenon is one of the most famous temples in Ancient Greece. Today you are going to plan how to build your own Parthenon.</p> <p>You learnt in <i>Coast to Coast</i> how to make towers by rolling paper for your lighthouses. How did we make sure that they were stable? What did we do to the bases? You could use that technique here or you could use toilet/kitchen roll tubes.</p> <p>It would be a good idea to make your columns today, ready to stick tomorrow. If you are using toilet tubes, try and colour white if you can.
