


Year 5 English activities week beginning 06/07/20

As well as these, you should also complete the Week 13 daily activities on Purple Mash.


These are the suggested activities for each day of the week. If your child prefers to complete the activities on different days, that is also completely fine.

<u>Monday 6th July</u>	<u>Challenge activities</u>
<p><u>Reading:</u></p> <p>Read for 30 minutes alone or with someone in your household. When you have finished reading, discuss 5 key points from the passage you have read.</p> <p>Tip: think about who, when, where, why and how.</p>	<p><u>Write a summary</u></p> <p>Think back to your Reciprocal Reading sessions and focus on summarising 5 key points from what you have read.</p> <p><u>Remember:</u></p> <p>A summary is written in your own words. A summary contains only the ideas of the original text. Do not insert any of your own opinions, interpretations, deductions or comments into a summary.</p> <p><u>Sentence starters:</u></p> <p>A key point from this passage is... From what I have read, a key point is...</p>
<u>Tuesday 7th July</u>	<u>Challenge activities</u>
<p><u>Spelling:</u></p> <p>Words with silent letters. How many can you identify in the book that you are currently reading?</p> <p>E.g. Plumber</p> <p>The letter b is silent.</p>	<p>Have a go at writing each word in a sentence (at least 8). Be sure to make them interesting!</p> <p>E.g. The grumpy, old plumber came out early this morning to fix the leaking tap.</p>



<u>Wednesday 8th July</u>	<u>Challenge activities</u>
<p><u>Grammar:</u></p> <p><u>Using hyphens to avoid ambiguity.</u></p> <p>Can you find examples of hyphens being used in the book you're reading?</p> <p>E.g. Rock-forming minerals. (These are minerals that form from rocks)</p> <p>E.g. The bad-tempered teacher. (The teacher who has a bad temper)</p>	<p><u>Using hyphens to avoid ambiguity</u></p> <p>Please watch the following video which will help to deepen your understanding of using hyphens.</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=1F7wFwdcfKg</p> <p>Can you write at least 5 interesting sentences that correctly use hyphens to avoid ambiguity?</p>

<p><u>What happens next?</u></p> <p>Write a short story about what could happen next in this picture:</p>  <p>Jane was on the 12th step when she awoke in her pyjamas...</p>	<p><u>Steps to follow</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Decide on the names of the main characters (Jane). You might think of other characters that could be included in your story. 2. Plan your story- what could happen next? Who will be involved? What will the problem be? How will it be resolved? 3. Begin writing your story and remember to include the features listed below- be creative! <p><u>What features will you need to include?</u></p> <p>Past tense Descriptive language Speech Expanded noun phrases Third person Hyphens to avoid ambiguity</p>	<p>You could write the beginning part of your story- how do the characters get to the point that they are in the picture?</p>
