#### Write a comic.

A comic includes pictures and text, usually as part of speech bubbles. See the below example.



#### Steps to follow:

- 1. Decide on a short plot- how will your comic begin? What will the problem be? How will it be resolved? You may want to include a superhero.
- 2. Decide on your main characters- stick to only a few.
- 3. Decide on how many pictures (and therefore boxes) you want10 might be a good number to begin with. Split your page into the appropriate number of boxes.
- 4. Give your comic book a title.
- 5. Draw in each picture and then include speech within speech bubbles.

### What features will you need to include?

- A title
- Pictures
- Speech within speech bubbles
- A story that follows in time order
- Short captions (not part of the speech but they can help the reader to understand the story better) underneath some pictures.

#### Write a persuasive speech.

A persuasive speech is written to encourage someone to say/do (or not say/do) something for particular reasons.

#### Steps to follow:

- 1. Think of an important issue for you e.g. picking up litter, walking instead of driving etc. It could be something that you are trying to persuade your families to do/don't do.
- 2. Consider your audience. Who will your speech be aimed at? Parents? Children? Your siblings?
- 3. Write a list of arguments for/against your issue. For example, if you were trying to persuade your brother not to eat your favourite chocolate from the fridge, you might argue that you had been saving it for a while. Try to come up with at least 3 arguments.
- 4. Using your arguments, write your speech- referring to examples/evidence necessary.

## What features will you need to include?

- An introduction to the issue- what is it? Why is it important to you?
- At least 3 clear arguments with evidence/examples
- Rhetorical questions e.g. how would you feel if someone had eaten something you were saving for a very long time?
- You may include emotive language- this is language that makes your audience feel a particular way such as fear, sadness, guilt etc.

Present your speech to others at home.

Write a script for a television show.  TV hosts need a script so that they know what they are saying and when.	Steps to follow:  1. Choose a theme for a television show (e.g. science, geography, comedy, educational). In class, we have had a go at being TV hosts for children's science shows.  2. Decide on what you want to share with your viewers. For example, if it's a science show, you may want to discuss a science investigation.  3. Create a short script detailing what the host (you!) will need to say. Consider carefully how you will begin and end your show. What features will you need to include?  • Informal, friendly language e.g. Hey there!  • Exciting and interesting vocabulary  • Rhetorical questions  • When performing, consider: your tone, body language, voice projection, body language, hand gestures, confidence.  Again, you have all been absolutely amazing with these in class.	Perform the script and act out being a host of the show -this could be recorded using a tablet.
