Monday 4 th and Tuesday 5 th	History	<p><u>Crime and punishment</u></p> <p><u>Monday</u> Pick a period in time and research how people were punished for different crimes. For example: Did you know that if you were caught stealing in Roman times, you would have to pay back your victim five times the amount that you stole? If you couldn't pay the amount back, you would be executed!</p> <p><u>Tuesday</u> When you have completed your research, show what you have learned in a manner of your choosing. You could: write a story or comic strip, write a non-chronological report, write a newspaper article, do something in the style of Horrible Histories. The choice is up to you! <p>Monday 11th</p>	<p>Music</p>	<p>Children could sing along to songs. Make an instrument from everyday objects and play it. Listen to different types of music. Write a review. <i>Did you like/dislike it? What would you change?</i> Rewrite lyrics to one of your favourite songs. Compile lists of favourite songs/artists/albums and explain why they are your favourite. Mr Marsh was recently challenged by a friend to choose his 10 favourite albums and really enjoyed writing the list and explaining his choices. Give it a go! <p>Tuesday 12th</p>	<p>Science: Investigation and observation</p>	<p><u>Static Electricity Butterfly</u> Teaches Children About: Electricity This experiment is a great way for children to learn about static electricity, and it's more fun and visual than just having them rub balloons against their heads. First you'll create a butterfly, using thick paper or cardboard for the body and tissue paper for the wings. Blow up the balloon and have the children rub it against their head for a few seconds. Then move the balloon to just above the butterfly's wings. The wings will move towards the balloon due to static electricity, and it'll look like the butterfly is flying. Materials Needed: Cardboard or thick paper, Tissue paper, Glue stick/glue, Balloon. Take some pictures of your butterflies, maybe a short video explanation and send them into your teachers on: 6o@sparkenhoe.leicester.sch.uk 6h@sparkenhoe.leicester.sch.uk If you can't get hold of the equipment for the investigation, try this instead. Compile a list of all electrical equipment in your house. Which items are battery powered? Which are mains powered? Try to find out which items use the most power.
