<p>Monday 01/02/21</p>	<p>Can you think of something for every letter of the alphabet? You will need:  1 cup of conditioner.  2 cups of corn flour.  Mix together until it reaches the consistency of pizza dough. If it's too dry, add more conditioner. Alternatively, instead of sight words, you can do this with numbers, shapes, colours or sounds.

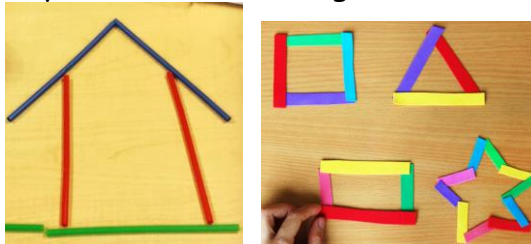
Cut out some bright words and pictures that you like from old magazines, newspapers, brochures, etc. and make a collage.
