(snake, sock, string, scarf, spoon, salt, soap)</p>	<p>Practice tracing, writing or copying the number 3 into your Home Learning Book</p>	<p>Get crafty with...wet toilet roll! put some toilet roll in a big bowl of water, take pieces out and squeeze the water out, and get making! (ideas: flour/shaving foam/torn up toilet roll/torn up paper/sugar/crushed ice/corn flour/cotton wool/tissues) Can you make a snow scene?</p>
